Line for professionals

Early Help Advice Line is for cases where professionals are not clear on the appropriate actions to take after consulting the Continuum of Need - Threshold document, where it is clear that the identified need is not a safeguarding concern, i.e. the child or young person is not at immediate risk of significant harm.

The structure of the Early Help Advice Line is as follows:

- Y Open from 9:00 17:00 Monday to Thursday and 9:00 16:30 on Fridays (with exception of bank holidays).
- This is not an emergency service where there is clear evidence of risk of significant harm to a child, a referral should be made immediately to Children's Services. Advice line will not accept or respond to any request for child protection advice.
- Professionals can expect a call back within 2 working days of contacting the service.
- Y Calls and advice given will be recorded against the associated child/children's record on Early Help Module (EHM) system.
- Y Professionals calling for advice, including key workers regarding a family with an open Families First Assessment in place, can seek advice and support from their Local Senior Families First Co-ordinator or Families First Co-ordinator.
