The figures in this report come from data from 1 July 2017 – 30 June 2018 (Q2 $_{(17/18)}$ - Q1 $_{(18/19)}$ of the financial year), unless otherwise noted



Data accurate as of 01/07/2018. We are aware of retrospective recording, and this will mean that Q1 (18/19) data is under-reported.



There is a time lag with some data (such as school attendance) which may result in under-reporting of presenting needs at the time of publishing this report



Keyworker agency reflects current keyworker at time of analysis



'FFA completed' refers to completion of assessment, *not* episode closure

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Hertfordshire summary





The started FFAs from the last year have included 3,295 children, which equates to 1.26% of all under-18s in the District.



The presenting needs most commonly recorded in FFAs are school absence / exclusions (72%), mental health (65%) and other Domestic Abuse (50%).



The success rate for outcomes achieved when FFAs are closed was 69%. 11% result in stepping up to Specialist & Safeguarding Services.



From Families Star Plus data, 'Your well-being' is the area with the lowest scoring initial need, with an average initial score of 5.5. For families with the lowest initial scores, more made progress in their Journey of Change with 'progress to work' (80%).





Hertfordshire total (935 closed cases)










Hertfordshire progress – Average change by domain


